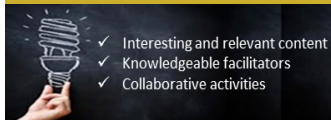


Accountable and Ethical Decision Making in the Public Sector Training

Learning Methodology

Aim

The Accountable and Ethical Decision Making (AEDM) in the Public Sector Program is based upon the Public Sector Commission's guidelines and assists agencies to meet their responsibility to provide their employees with information about accountability requirements and better equip them to deal with situations/issues that they may encounter.

The course is delivered in-house for your organisation and will enhance participant's ability to participate effectively in WA Public Sector recruitment and selection processes.

The course is tailored to include your organisation's Code of Conduct and internal policies so that participants will be able to confidently apply their learnings in the workplace.



Objectives

At the end of the course participants will be able to:

- Understand what accountable and ethical decision making is, within the Public Sector context, and specifically in the context of their own agency;
- Appreciate the Public Sector accountability, integrity and ethics framework, including the legislation, Public Sector principles and compliance instruments that underpin the work of all Public Servants;
- Clearly articulate their responsibilities in regards to standards of behavior and business activities;
- Apply a simple 4-question process to assess the ethics of decision making in the work environment; and
- Know where to get help or further information.
